Dilemma of Egg Imports......

Sri Lankan layer industry is currently facing the worst ever challenge it had to face since its emergence and gradual development as a commercial layer industry.

Though there were several contributory factors leading to shortage of eggs and resultant high prices, general public was not concerned about those issues. Plight of layer farmers and associated problems were not

given much publicity and allegations were made against egg farmers, associations and even Authorities by media throughout the period. Instead, public was made to believe on 'unreasonable egg prices, eggmafia, etc. etc' through our somewhat 'unethical medial culture'. Unfortunately lack of or no coordination and understanding between two responsible Ministries of Agriculture (Livestock) and Trade added fuel to this scenario. On the other hand, there was no straight forward solution for shortage of eggs and eventually a policy decision was taken by the government to import eggs to fulfill the seasonal demand. As a result, large consignments of eggs were being imported into the country, for the first time in the history since stoppage of table egg imports in early 60's following self- sufficiency in the egg industry.

Although it is expected to resume production levels into normalcy and price drops of eggs to affordable levels in the near future , past events would likely to be a ' highly un favorable precedence' to the Sri Lankan Layer Industry.

Who could assure that import of eggs would never happen in the future, whenever there is an imbalance between supply and demand? Similar to what has happened to the Paddy Industry in Sri Lanka ?????.

Thus ,this is a good 'Opportunity' to all stake holders of the layer industry to get together and to develop and implement short, medium and long term plans collectively , with the support of policy makers, in order to reduce production costs and provide 'quality eggs' at affordable prices to consumers.

WPSA-SL is geared to facilitate and support any such move, within our purview, for the betterment of layer industry in our country.
